


## Transplant Scorecard No. 24 – Year Ended December 2014

The December 2014 Transplant Scorecard reflects a most disappointing quarterly decline in the number of transplant recipients in Australia from the year end September 2014 (1143) to the year end December 2014 (1117). Since the establishment of Organ and Tissue Authority (OTA), yearly transplant recipients per million population have increased from 39.4 (December 2008) to 47.3 (December 2014), an increase of 3.3% per annum. Reaching the target 90 transplant recipieint per million population can only be achieved by the complete and effective implementation of solutions to organ donation and transplanation solutions in leading countries. ShareLife is calling on the government to completely implement the internationally recognised proven solution to achieve world leading performance.
