



Transplant Scorecard No.33 March 2017


The March 2017 Transplant Scorecard reflects an decrease in the number of transplant recipients in Australia for the 12 months, Jan'16 – Dec'16 (1448) to Apr'16 – Mar'17 (1438). Since the establishment of Organ and Tissue Authority (OTA), 12-monthly transplant recipients per million population have increased from 39.4 (Dec 2008) to 58.7 (Mar 2017), an increase of 5.9% per annum. Australia's ultimate goal of 80 to 90 transplant recipients per million population can only be achieved if proven leading performance solutions to organ donation and transplantation are fully and effectively implemented. Given the aim to establish Australia as a world leader in organ donation for transplantation, ShareLife Australia is calling on the Government to completely implement the internationally recognised proven solution to achieve world's leading performance.
